NEW ZEALAND	This week in Year 2, we have started our journey into instruction writing. Embracing the festive season,

	honed their creative flair by crafting pouches in textiles, gaining hands-on experience and cultivating fine	
	motor skills. Meanwhile, in Maths, pupils embarked on an exciting exploration of symmetry.	
MALTA	This week in Malta class we have had a fantastic week exploring key transport links around the U.K. On








NOTICE BOARD
