# What we have been learning this week...

ANTIGUA	This week in Antigua class we have continued to explore the theme "winter" and what a treat it was to experience the snow on Monday. We explored a range of arctic animals in our snowy tough trays, had fun making snowy prints using cutters and cotton buds as well as explored dinosaurs stuck in the snow. Alongside our topic we have worked on our fine motor skills using scissors and also threading pasta onto spaghetti. Another super fun week in Antigua!	
ST LUCIA	This week in St Lucia, we have been continuing our topic of what's that roar! Our second week on dinosaurs and our dinosaur egg hatched! We are so excited to watch it grow, and we are looking after it before the mummy comes back and collects it! We have also been exploring the cold weather and left some bowls outside overnight which we are hoping will freeze!	
MALDIVES	Year 1 has been busy working on 3D and 2D shapes in maths. In English, we wrote diary entries all about Katie Morag delivering the mail to the wrong people. In PE, we are learning to dance to 'The Lion King.' In computing, we are grouping and sorting and in phonics we are consolidating phase four. Following recent Little Wandle assessments, all the children have changed their phase and set for reading which is fantastic news. Well done everybody!	
NEW ZEALAND	This week in New Zealand class, we finished our narrative writing inspired by 'The Lion Inside'. In Maths, we continued with money, with pupils confidently navigating through the realms of pence and pounds, enhancing their understanding of real-world transactions. In the realm of science, our curious minds embarked on a journey exploring life cycles within the context of 'Animals Including Humans'. Additionally, we delved into history, exploring what makes a person significant before we look at nurses from the past.	
MALTA	This week in Malta class we have been looking at multiplication and division in Maths. The children have been grouping and sharing to solve a range of sums and have learnt to exchange numbers. On Tuesday, the children completed a practical experiment in science. The children tested the permeability and durability of rocks and recorded the results in their books. On Thursday, the children published a CV which they wrote to apply for the job of an archaeologist.	
GALAPAGOS	This week year 4 has had a very exciting time! For our topic, crime and punishment, the children were taken on a journey to Carisbrooke Castle where they learned all about King Charles I imprisonment, his treatment compared to other prisoners and about life at the castle in general. We even met a couple of the donkeys who help to retrieve water from the old well. Although a very cold day, the weather stayed on our side, and we all had an amazing time	
ICELAND	We made paper aeroplanes with the RAF Science Day. We used paper straws, blutak, paper, glue and masking tape. The we tested them in the hall to see what went the furthest. In maths we did long multiplication. In English we are writing a diary. By Theo	
JAMAICA	This week in Year 6 we have been doing variety of activities, In English we have been doing a diary entry. On the story of maths we have been doing Algebra with letters. In science we have been learning about evolution. In guided reading we have practiced our SATs and been answering questions on this. In history we have been learning about the Maya civilization. On Wednesday we had a STEM workshop and we bult gliders and designed sustainable aircraft. We also continued with our Gods eye. In Collective Worship we did peace.	
CUBA	This week in Cuba Class we been doing lots of exciting activities. Our favourite part of the week was exploring the snow and seeing real life snow to make our topic of winter even more exciting. We have also been learning about transport, we listened to different vehicle sounds and managed to decide together which vehicle was making each sound. Finally, we have been practicing our turn taking skills and have been sharing games on the interactive whiteboard.	
HAWAII	This week in Hawaii Class, the children have been making maps to create different patterns for Bee Bots to follow. They have also been working with clay to make patterned tiles. The class used a variety of tools to shape their tiles before adding their pattern. In English, the children have been creating sentences using different forms of transport.




# YEAR 5 & 6 SCIENCE WORKSHOP
